Always willing to share his hard earned fishing secrets, this program will provide information that even the local guides may not be willing to divulge.

Mel is no stranger to adventure fly fishing. Some of his frequently visited favorite rivers in the U.S. include the Green River in Utah, the Missouri and Bighorn in Montana, the Trinity in California, and the South Fork of the Boise and South Fork of the Snake in Idaho. (Mel knows all of these rivers intimately, but he may not be able to give you much information about local accommodations because he invariably camps on the banks of his river of choice in his elaborately outfitted "Trout Mobile" van. Who needs hotels?) But Mel's experience doesn't end there. During the palolo worm hatch in Florida he may be found chasing tarpon in the Florida Keys, and everyone is sure to remember Mel and his brother Neil's program presentation that focused on camping and fishing for sea-run brown trout in Tierra del Fuego, Argentina – all accomplished on a do-it-yourself, learn-as-you-go basis.

Trout in the Classroom Release Dates - March 15 and 20

Here is your opportunity to give back to the sport of fly fishing! Assist elementary school students to learn about our sport while they release rainbow trout fry into Kenneth Hahn Lake that they have raised in their classrooms from eggs.

Mark the dates: Thursday, March 15 and Tuesday March 20.

Trout in the Classroom (TIC) is an annual hands-on activity through which our club introduces students to active outdoor learning. During the release outings, which are the culmination of a classroom science unit, WFF volunteers help the students try out fly casting, observe fly tying, catch aquatic insects for examination under magnification, and release their classroom aquarium trout into a thriving stream environment at Kenneth Hahn State Recreation Area.

We meet at Kenneth Hahn Lake near Culver City at 9:00 am. TIC activities end at 12:30 pm. Volunteers enjoy a complimentary picnic lunch together after the morning's activities.





- How can I continue to improve my casting skills?
- How can I share my passion for casting and fly fishing with others?

The Certified Casting Instructor program of Fly Fishers International answers both by providing a thoughtfully structured syllabus of casting skills to be mastered with an equally important emphasis on teaching technique and a thorough grounding in casting theory. As such, it provides a road map for becoming the caster we want to be and a teacher who can effectively share their skills with others.

Going back to the early 1990's, the Certified Casting Instructor program was conceived as a way to provide both consistency and a higher standard in teaching others how to fly cast. Today, over fifty instructors who are active in the Southwest Council of the FFI have earned the CCI or Master Casting Instructor title. This clinic will provide a window on how you could become one of them by:

- Providing hands on demonstration and practice in each of the required casting skills.
- Highlighting study sources needed to become a knowledgeable teacher.
- Explaining the role of a mentor and how to find one.
